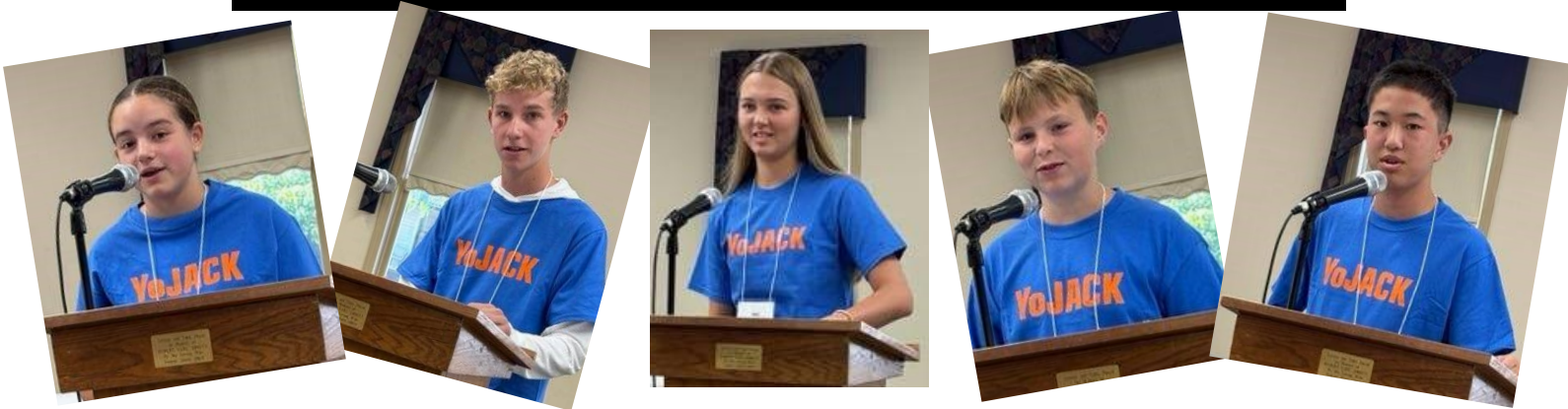


How did you become interested in LJC?

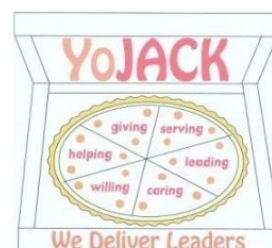
